
Crash trauma, evidence and ethics feature at Australian Lawyers Alliance ACT Conference

Crash trauma, evidence, mysteries and myths are just some of the topics being explored at the Australian Lawyers Alliance annual ACT conference in Canberra this week.

About 60 lawyers and academics will take part in the conference, which starts at the Hyatt Hotel at 8am on Friday (25 June, 2010).

Australian Federal Police Sergeant, Daryl Neit, who has attended more than 150 fatal accidents in and around ACT, will head the program.

Also speaking will be certified professional ergonomist and physiotherapist, Marcia Lusted, who will present Sprains and Strains – Evidence, Mysteries and Myths.

Moray & Agnew partner, Emma Reilly, will give a Comparison of Damages; University of Canberra Professor, Patricia Easteal AM, will speak on Working to Effectuate Justice; a CTP update will be given by Sparke Helmore senior associate, James Treloar; and tips on the paperless office will be run by Blumers Lawyers director, Noor Blumer.

Two separate case review sessions will also be led by consultant lawyer, Tim Sharman, and another with barrister, Greg Stretton, and lawyer, Andrew Muller. The ever-popular Hypothetical – ‘How Ethical Are You?’ will also be hosted by barrister, Andrew Stone.

The Australian Lawyers Alliance is a non-profit, national association of about 1,500 lawyers and academics devoted to protecting and promoting justice, freedom and the rights of the individual.

It lobbies government to review laws that obstruct access to justice and hosts conferences in most states and territories, each year, to promote the fertile exchange of legal information to further this aim.
